Scouts honor three outstanding women at annual Leadership Luncheon

Racine, WI -- On Tuesday, June 11, the Three Harbors Council honored the leadership of RCEDC (Racine County Economic Development Corp.) with the Good Scout Award at the Lighthouse Leadership Luncheon at Infusino's Banquet Hall. Those leaders representing RCEDC included Jenny Trick, Executive Director, Laura Million, Business Development Manager, and Carolyn Engel, Business Finance Manager.

"When I learned that RCEDC leadership would receive the Good Scout Award, I was both humbled and grateful," said Jenny Trick, RCEDC Executive Director. 1. Outstanding community service;
2. Interest and leadership to organizations; and,
3. Respect and esteem held by their colleagues.

"The vision of what we do is to prepare every eligible youth in America to become a responsible, participating citizen and leader who is guided by the Scout Oath and Law," said Mary Kveton, District Executive for Lighthouse District. "Jenny, Laura and Carolyn are shining examples of this vision and we're proud to honor them at this year's ceremony."

Past recipients of the Good Scout Award include Matt Andis, Dominic Cariello, Herb Katt, Jon Antonneau, Dave Perkins, Dave Eberle, and Jud Wyant. Congressman Paul Ryan was the first Lighthouse Leadership Luncheon guest speaker, prior to his position as the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

Each year, one Eagle Scout is chosen to present the award. Out of 19 candidates, Roger Janusiak from Troop 222 was chosen to present the Good Scout Award to the leaders at RCEDC.
