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Racine County Housing Study Now Available: RCEDC Hosts Community Discussion on Key Findings and Development Needs

Racine County, WI – On **October 10, 2024**, the Racine County Economic Development Corporation (RCEDC) held a community event at Gateway Technical College's SC Johnson iMET Center to discuss findings from the newly released Racine County Housing Study. Supported by Racine County, the Wisconsin Realtors Association, and the Southshore Realtors Association, the event brought together local stakeholders, real estate professionals, and community members to explore the county's housing needs and growth opportunities.

The housing study, conducted by Tracy Cross & Associates and initially delivered in January 2020, provides a detailed analysis of Racine County's demographics, employment growth, residential supply, and future demand. The study estimated a need for 890 new residential units annually, and RCEDC has since tracked over 4,000 units in development to meet this growing demand.

The event highlighted both the challenges and opportunities in achieving Racine's housing goals, with an emphasis on collaboration to support future growth. Attendees engaged in an open forum to discuss ways to address the region's housing needs.
